Behavioral Health Provider – LCSW Licensed Clinical (Independent) Social Worker

Starting Salary: Salary based upon credentials

St. Luke's Behavioral Health Provider will provide on-going counseling, assessment, diagnosis and treatment plans for our patient population, which includes adults and children who are low-income and/or homeless. This provider will be a collaborative partner in our health and wellness programs, and help develop our behavioral health program, including helping setting up and directing support groups, as well as one-on-one counseling. This position will be supervised by the Behavioral Health Director.

Major Functions and Responsibilities: In conjunction with St. Luke's health provider team, oversees the behavioral health functions while also providing direct patient care. He/she supervises the behavioral health social work interns and collaborates with the behavioral health director.

Major Activities and End Results:

- 1. Provide direct patient screening, assessment, and therapy to homeless and indigent adults and children.
- 2. Supervise social work interns.
- Assist with formal/informal mental health and substance abuse training for staff, providing programs to address the various behavioral health issues afflicting patients.
- 4. Help develop comprehensive delivery service systems, in collaboration with the medical director, for primary care patients with behavioral health needs. This means assisting with developing evidence-based screening and assessment tools appropriate to St. Luke's and its patient population.
- Help develop counseling program targeting needs of seasonal agricultural or migrant workers.
- 6. Keep abreast of behavioral health trends of high-risk populations such as those relevant to homeless or the economically disadvantaged people.
- 7. Comply with quality improvement plans and activities.
- 8. Coordinate with other clinical staff and management on program planning and evaluation.
- 9. Document work with patients into our EHR system and for our grant requirements.



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Experience, Knowledge and Skills

- Minimum Qualifications: Experience working with under-served populations, providing behavioral health services to people who are low-income and/or homeless. Clinical supervision experience.
- Desired Qualifications: Bilingual or Spanish-English proficiency working with multiple evidence-based practices including trauma-informed care and motivational interviewing.
